### All-Ireland Pollinator Plan (2023): Business Supporters - Annual Review

#### 1.0 FOREWORD

Another year of global instability, fuelled by the terrible wars in Gaza and Ukraine, and a seemingly unending series of climate-related disasters has accelerated, almost exponentially, the complex pressures on business already striving to address challenges across energy, water, circular economy, climate and, of course, biodiversity.

Tackling biodiversity loss can feel nebulous and vast, with many possible solutions and potential offerings. We know we have to act fast and be ambitious in our restoration of nature, but we must also be considered and diligent in our endeavours.

#### Pollinators as a 'proxy'

'Ambition' meets evidence-based actions in the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan (AIPP), an entry level into biodiversity on any site, for any size of company and within any sector. Simply put, when we support pollinators – think of them as a 'proxy' - we have an almost immediate 'impact' on wider biodiversity.

Consider incorporating the AIPP framework as a biodiversity pillar in your ESG/sustainability plan. It is aligned to ISO14001:2015 and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 15 and 13, and provides:

- (i) Evidence-based actions to help shape 'value chain' SMART targets (employees, suppliers, community).
- (ii) A publicly available GIS mapping and reporting accountability structure.
- (iii) And formal mechanisms to track (measure) what is happening on your business site through pollinator monitoring/recording initiatives.

#### All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2021-2025

Now in its eighth year, the AIPP has gathered momentum across the island through the participation of over 300 businesses, local Councils (100% across the island), over 100 government departments and NGOs, as well as many thousands of communities/volunteer groups, farmers, schools, and gardeners.

#### Our strengthening relationship with our funders

The *National Biodiversity Data Centre* expresses its deep gratitude to the joint funders. In 2023, the Agri-business officer position was part funded by Bord Bia Origin Green. Funding was also provided by Natural Capital Ireland (supported by the National Parks and Wildlife Service), with this used to support the Business for Biodiversity Platform.

#### Bord Bia's Origin Green food sustainability programme

As part of the deepening partnership with Origin Green, the AIPP delivered three webinars within the 'Origin Green – Pathways to Pollinator-Biodiversity' series, participated in Bord Bia's Bloom event (June 2023) and has engaged with numerous agri-business and non-agri-business in helping with the understanding and delivery of AIPP evidence-based actions. Origin Green provides the AIPP structure within members' targets (optional). Sarah Kelly continues to strengthen and expand the business supporter network.

#### Business for Biodiversity Platform www.businessforbiodiversity.ie

The multi-stakeholder platform is being established using seed funding, provided by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage (DHLGH) and the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) and, over a three-year period <a href="The National Biodiversity Data Centre">The National Biodiversity Data Centre</a> (NBDC) and <a href="Business in the Community Ireland">Business in the Community Ireland</a> (BITCI) are supporting development of the Platform. It is due to launch in early 2024 and will provide webinars, 'communities of practice', learning tools and courses for businesses who wish to strengthen their nature-positive credentials, through a collegiate-style, peer-learning mechanism, which ties into the European and global business and biodiversity initiatives.

#### **Social Innovation**

The All-Ireland Pollinator Plan continues to collaborate with ChangeX (<a href="www.changex.org">www.changex.org</a>), the social innovation platform which draws together excellent social innovation projects, funding partners (e.g. large corporates seeking community investment projects), and community/volunteer groups seeking initiatives to develop in their communities such as the Pollinator Plan.

#### Re-emergence and arrival of new wild bees as our climate changes

We announced the re-discovery of the <u>Perkins' mining bee</u> in 2023, not seen in Ireland in 50 years. You may recall we announced the arrival of the <u>Hairy Footed Flower</u> bee (*Anthophora plumipes*) in March 2022 and the Ivy bee (*Colletes hederae*) in November 2021.

#### Protecting the island's natural capital

The All-Ireland Pollinator Plan remains, and will always be, a biodiversity plan of action for the island without political affiliation or agenda other than to preserve and protect the natural capital for generations to come, shape guidance based on *evidence*, and to mitigate, where possible, the effect of climate change.

As regulations such as the EU's *Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive* (CSRD) - and 2029's *Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive* (CSDDD) - bring nature issues further up the corporate agenda, businesses will increasingly need to consider how their business models are compatible with a nature-positive economy and society.

To those who have committed to, and delivered on, actions for wild pollinators and wider biodiversity, we thank you. This is *your* report.

#### 2.0 GOVERNANCE & ACCOUNTABILITY

#### All Ireland Pollinator Plan 2021-2025

- A 16-member steering group provides oversight of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2021-2025.
- The AIPP is implemented by the **National Biodiversity Data Centre**, and actively addresses a time-critical biodiversity challenge.
- It is a shared plan of action for the island now in its eighth year, which builds on targets within *The EU 2030 Biodiversity Strategy*. It is cited in Ireland's 3<sup>rd</sup> National Biodiversity Action Plan; the 4<sup>th</sup> NBAP is due to be published in 2024. It is also indicated with reference to the National Biodiversity Data Centre in *Northern Ireland's Biodiversity Plan to 2020* (Page 20, No.30), to halt and reverse pollinator decline.
- It is aligned with Bord Bia's Origin Green Charter as pollinator actions supporting members' biodiversity targets.
- All of the simple, evidence-based pollinator-biodiversity mapped actions delivered by businesses are
  tracked nationally on the National Biodiversity Data Centre's pollinator database. This accumulated
  data, supports the evidence-based actions provided under the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2021-2025.
  To date 316 companies are implementing actions within the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan across the
  island with the support of over 100 government (central and local) and NGO partner organisations,
  as well as thousands of communities and farmers.
- N.B. Participation/support for the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan does not equate to endorsement of products or services by the AIPP.

#### 3.0 INTRODUCTION


#### Businesses – the drive towards nature-positive

The ability to report on nature (pollinators) and map evidence-based actions through the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan provides a simple mechanism for all sizes of business on the island to support delivery of nature-positive goals. We are thrilled at the increased level of understanding, the uptake of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan evidence-based actions, and the increased numbers mapping on *Actions for Pollinators* (GIS).

#### 2023's Actions for Pollinators (GIS) View

As of the end of November 2023, **1,180** business sites are logged on 'Actions for Pollinators' (GIS) with the associated actions. N.B. Some business supporters will log multiple sites.

Thank you to all businesses who have mapped for taking the time. N.B. AIPP will continue to work with companies still to map ('In Train') on 'Actions for Pollinators' (GIS) through Q1 of 2024.



#### Joint Funders - Thank You

We are so grateful to our funders. In 2023, the Agri-business officer position was part funded by Bord Bia Origin Green. Funding was also provided by Natural Capital Ireland (supported by the National Parks and Wildlife Service). The financial support they have provided in 2023 has enabled the AIPP to engage with **74** new business supporters and many existing AIPP business supporters.

AIPP deliverables in 2023 to Origin Green have included: Three 'Pathways to Pollinator-Biodiversity' webinars for Origin Green with a total of 94 attendees with topics such as: Healthy Hedgerows, Protecting Farmland Pollinators (EIP) Project, Ireland's National Pollinator Monitoring Scheme (IPoMS) and measurement and monitoring tools available via the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan and the National Biodiversity Data Centre.

Participation in, and speaking at, Bord Bia's annual Bloom event also provided a key point of engagement with a wider audience. The Agri-business officer also delivered numerous online webinars and one-to-one Teams meetings with businesses to present the simple entry-level into biodiversity. We are delighted to continue to support Origin Green Members and the wider business community on this nature-positive journey.

In 2023 the National Biodiversity Data Centre has also been working with partners Natural Capital Ireland and Business in the Community Ireland, to bring to fruition a platform to support businesses in their move towards nature-positive.

The multi-stakeholder platform is being established using seed funding, provided by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage (DHLGH) and the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) and, over a three-year period <a href="The National Biodiversity Data Centre">The National Biodiversity Data Centre</a> (NBDC) and <a href="Business in the Community Ireland">Business in the Community Ireland</a> (BITCI) are supporting development of the Platform.

In 2023, the Agri-business officer has participated in the BFBI *Communities of Practice*, provided key information to support the development of the platform and has also created every opportunity to signpost AIPP Business supporters to the platform.

This report would not happen without the support of our funders which has facilitated the engagement with an extensive network of multi-sector businesses across the island to help them understand this simple 'entry-level into biodiversity'.

#### Business Sponsorship in the community – eliciting an evidence-based response

Pollinator-related community sponsorship is on the rise as businesses employ the AIPP companion resources (Resources » All-Ireland Pollinator Plan (pollinators.ie)) to elicit evidence-based responses with their sponsorship.

We are seeing a year on year increasing focus on pollinators through:

- The Tidy Towns *Local Authority Pollinator Award* funded by the Heritage and Biodiversity Officers and judged by the AIPP.
- The social innovation platform ChangeX with the AIPP evidence-based pollinator-ready projects <u>Start Pollinator Plans (changex.org)</u>.

Fascinating potential companion projects are emerging through the *GAA Green Clubs Toolkit* <u>GAA Green Club Programme | Tobar</u> - the AIPP collaborated on the biodiversity section - and through *Biodiversity in Schools* <u>Pollinator Project (biodiversityinschools.com)</u>. And there is also some wonderful work underway to support our rare and beautiful Large Carder Bee which we will tell you more about in 2024.

#### Pollinator Monitoring and Measurement – a next step for AIPP business supporters

Equally exciting is that we are seeing an uptick in 'measurement' as businesses embark on baseline ecological surveys via the *Chartered Institute of Ecology and Environmental Management* (www.cieem.net) including the National Pollinator Monitoring Methodology.

We are also seeing an increase in those participating in the formal scientific mechanisms/schemes to measure the success of evidence-based actions through the very simple weekly Flower Insect Timed (FIT) Counts and the more complex (but very do-able for non-pollinator experts) monthly Bumblebee Monitoring Scheme <a href="https://pollinators.ie/record-pollinators/">https://pollinators.ie/record-pollinators/</a>

We would encourage every AIPP business supporter in 2024 to participate in one, or both, of the above schemes as a key formal, scientific 'measurement' piece. We honestly cannot stress how valuable the data provided is. It allows us to track properly what is happening with our wild pollinators, and to identify the best actions to protect them. Without the generous efforts of existing participants, we simply would be unable to do this.

- In this year AIPP has published companion resources for business including: Car Parks for Pollinators
  flyer, Pollinator-friendly management of Solar Farms guideline, Sensory Garden flyer, How-to-guide:
  Creating and restoring Meadows in local communities and gardens, Top Ten pollinator-friendly
  plants for different situations, Orchards guidelines and specific guidelines on helping the Large
  Carder Bee.
- Other publications: the AIPP and Origin Green collaborated on and published <u>Pathways to</u> <u>Pollinator-biodiversity – Processors' supply chains</u>. And in conjunction with Cluíd, is the housing

related *Landscaping and Biodiversity Guide for New Developments* <u>Landscaping-and-Biodiversity-Guide-for-web.pdf</u> (cluid.ie).

Due for publication in Q1 of 2024 are the updated AIPP *Businesses: actions to help pollinators* guidelines which will include not only a *Business Pollinator Scoring Checklist* to help identify how valuable an action is, but also a handy, easy-read *Retailers for Pollinators Assessment* Table to identify how pollinator-friendly your retail/business car park is.

We are humbled and are so grateful to all AIPP Business Supporters for the commitment and drive to deliver evidence-based actions in 2023 in support of the island's pollinators and wider biodiversity reflected in this *Annual Review 2023*.

This is your journey. These are your stories.



#### 4.0 2022 ANNUAL REVIEW - the stats

This fifth Annual Review 2023 provides an update of the evidence-based actions each business is taking to deliver on the AIPP inside and outside their buildings, supported by their 'value chain' (Employees, Suppliers and local Communities).

Since inception, the number of AIPP businesses supporters has increased year on year. This year the AIPP saw a slight decrease in business supporters.

- An increase of 74 new businesses, in the period 1 November 2022 31 October 2023 from 335 supporters to 409, was experienced.
- With the new 2021-2025 phase requirement for businesses to submit an Annual Review report and map actions on 'Actions for Pollinators', 93 have not submitted and will be removed from the business supporters list. N.B. They may re-engage at any point.
- **59 of Bord Bia Origin Green's verified member companies have reported** which has been confirmed by Origin Green.
- For 2023, 316 (59 Origin Green members plus 257 multi-sector) businesses across the island are supporting the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2021-2025 (AIPP) through actions for pollinatorsbiodiversity.

#### **5.0 KEY LEARNING 2023** www.pollinators.ie

As the AIPP engages further with business our understanding of messaging is improving. The following are recurring themes.

#### On site evidence-based actions: Resources » All-Ireland Pollinator Plan (pollinators.ie)

Mow less in grassy areas is the No.1 action to support wild bees on your business site. CUT+LIFT as this reduces soil fertility and allows natural regeneration of wildflowers. It may take 2 or 3 years – but it is a more sustainable and cost-effective method of providing food, shelter and safety for wild bees. Review the level of biodiversity supported by a reduced mowing meadow Page 6 Meadow-Guideline-2023-WEB.pdf (pollinators.ie)

Native pollinator-friendly hedgerows are an excellent biodiversity action to support wild bees.

They provide food, shelter, nesting (beneath in the tussocky grass) for bumblebees and a 'flight path' to protect from wind, rain and predators. Don't forget to retain *Bramble* and *Ivy*, both great food sources, if present. *Beech/Laurel*, though beautiful, are NOT great for pollinators. For businesses adjacent to farmland, consider working with your farm-neighbours to develop a native hedgerow *Farmland: actions to help pollinators*.ie/farmland

**Designate specific nesting wild bee nesting sites on your business site including:** a south facing earth banks/verge, tussocky grass at the base of a native hedgerow, cracks in an old stone wall, a bee hotel.

Eliminate or reduce the use of pesticides (herbicides/insecticides) – this cannot be emphasized enough.

N.B. Continue to spot spray invasive species <a href="https://www.invasives.ie">www.invasives.ie</a>

#### On site actions to be aware of:

Check the provenance of native pollinator-friendly hedgerow (OR individual tree) options. A Blackthorn purchased from central Europe will flower at the wrong time of year for our wild bees.

- Choose Peat Free products (protecting a key habitat).
- Eliminate pesticides where possible. N.B. Continue to spot-spray invasive species (www.invasives.ie)
- Choose Neonicotinoid Free products.

#### On site actions to avoid (also when considering sponsorship):

Sowing/scattering wildflower seed mixes is NOT a biodiversity action under the AIPP. It is a horticultural action. Make the distinction. Non-native mixes may contain invasive species such as Black Grass — potentially devastating for agricultural land. Native mixes may contain a high percentage of annuals so may need re-sown next year. Review Why we don't recommend wildflower seed mixes » All-Ireland Pollinator Plan (pollinators.ie)

Seed bombs/wildflower seed packets as corporate gifts/community sponsorship is NOT a biodiversity action. Instead, think about early spring bulbs *Crocus/Grape Hyacinth* for early Bumblebees or Heathers or Herbs. Review pollinator-friendly options here: Top-Ten-pollinator-plants-Guide-WEB.pdf (pollinators.ie)

To have honey bee hives on your business site is NOT a biodiversity action under the AIPP.

Managing honeybees is a wonderful hobby and a personal/company choice. The honeybee, as a managed pollinator, is not under threat and increased numbers may create competition for food for our 100+ species of wild bee. Please seek expert advice from a local beekeeping association if you are considering.

1a. Which evidence-based <u>PHYSICAL (A-E)</u> pollinator-biodiversity action(s) has your business/ organisation taken in 2023?

- A Retained our biodiversity area.
- **B** ABP Cahir has maintained our No Mow policy in our biodiversity areas on site.
- **C** We have planted a 'Wellness Garden' on site as an area for staff to sit on breaks. In this area we planted a cherry tree and many pollinator-friendly flowers such as coneflowers, daisies, catmint, crane's- bill, geraniums, and verbena.
- **D** We have eliminated all pesticides and herbicides on site, except where spot spraying is necessary.
- **E** We have 2 bee hotels on site in ABP Cahir that have resident wild bees. 2 bee hotels were also installed in Coláiste Dún Iascaigh.
- F ABP Cahir has also collaborated with the Cahir Tidy Towns Committee to plant native trees and wildflower species in areas such as the Swiss Walk and the Inch Field in Cahir while also maintaining the biodiversity already present. We are protecting our pollinator habitats on site and off site such as stone walls and areas of pollinator friendly plant species. In collaboration with Coláiste Dún Iascaigh in Cahir a biodiversity area was created on the school campus and planted 150 pollinator friendly trees and wildflower patches, this project also involved the Tidy Towns. Wildflowers were planted with Cahir primary school Bunscoil na Cathrach with the students.

**1b.** Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in **2023? YES.** We planted native pollinator friendly trees with the Tidy Towns and local supplier farmer and on site we allowed wildflowers to grown naturally in our biodiversity areas.

1c. Did you choose an alternative action to managing honeybee hives/an apiary in 2023? We have no beehives on site, only our solitary bee hotels.

### 2. Which evidence-based <u>COMMUNICATION (F)</u> pollinator-biodiversity action(s) has your business/ organisation taken in 2023?

- ABP Biodiversity Officer Krista Keating gave talks in the local schools educating students on the importance of biodiversity, water stewardship and climate change actions. Students also engaged with creating 5-year biodiversity action plans for their campuses and were very hands on when tree and flower planting was done as well as species richness surveys. On Sunday August 13<sup>th</sup>, ABP Cahir was asked to take part in National Heritage Week in Cahir at the Heritage Sunday Event. ABP was asked to create a display stand to educate on the importance of biodiversity, the risks of invasive species and to advertise all ABP Cahir does for the local environment. Shauna O' Dwyer, biodiversity champion attended the fun day in the Inch Field and set up a stand with a bee hotel, colouring pages for children and information packets, all illustrating the importance of protecting our local pollinators. Adults and children alike were very interested in becoming more biodiversity conscious and wanted to learn how they could protect and maintain biodiversity at home.
- On Friday September 15<sup>th</sup>, Shauna gave a presentation to this year's TY students in the local secondary school on biodiversity and sustainability and encouraged the class to come up with ideas for biodiversity projects in the school.



- In the past year, ABP partnered with two schools to boost on-site biodiversity.
- The collaboration undertaken with St. Ailbes Secondary School in Tipperary Town and Gurteen College reflects a commitment to fostering environmental stewardship and biodiversity awareness within educational institutions. This initiative involves the provision of a substantial number of trees to both schools, thereby serving as a testament to their dedication to ecological sustainability.
- At St. Ailbes Secondary School, a strategic long-term biodiversity plan has been set in motion, encompassing a comprehensive timeline of three years. As an integral component of this plan, an allocation of 120 trees has been thoughtfully provided, facilitating the active participation of students in the planting process. By engaging students directly in this effort, the school is teaching valuable hands-on experience regarding the fundamental role that trees play in preserving ecological balance.
- Gurteen College's innovative 'Diamond Grove' initiative entails planting 75 native trees to symbolize its 75-year history, celebrating both legacy and conservation. In addition, the college's hedge planting strategy, now incorporating 425 trees, demonstrates a holistic approach to ecological diversity and sustainability.







- These institutions demonstrate sustainable practices, biodiversity advocacy, and educational engagement through tree planting. Their efforts not only enrich local ecosystems but also cultivate a culture of environmental responsibility.



- Maintained the wildflower meadows at the Regional Distribution Centres in Cork and Kildare. Both meadows contain native wildflower mix, providing a habitat for endangered species. They contain signage (F), bird boxes and insect boxes.

- A We are working on a project to widen our wildflower meadow this year to allow more space for the bees and insects to roam freely. After putting a lot of thought into its location and preparation.
- We decided to plant the meadow with help from our local farmer to rotavate and sow the seeds in a location away from the noisy, busy roads, so the bees and insects had more space to roam freely.
- B We have also reduced the frequency of mowing which allows the wildflower (food) to flower among the longer grass.
- E We have minimised pesticides on all sites except for spot-spraying when absolutely necessary.
- C Additionally, at our farm site we programmed an 8.5 acre field to sow with a cover crop to aid the pollination of our pumpkins. The sowing dates of the cover crop was planned to optimise the flowering period of the Phacelia, Vetch and Clover within our cover crop to maximise the availability of flowering plants for the pollinating bees and insects.





- A Our main physical pollinator biodiversity area onsite is what we call our "Environmentally Sensitive Area". This area is on a quiet area of the farm which borders a 50 acre wood called Balrath Wood. This has a large number of species of trees. We have also started to introduce trees with honey plants to this area in the aim that they will supply food to the bees.
- A Finnegan's keep more than 7% of our land as a space for nature. Our aim is to retain and manage existing biodiversity habitats rather than establishing new ones. These areas are maintained in a natural state to promote biodiversity and to create feed areas for birds, bees and invertebrates. These areas include ponds, wetlands, woodland plots, wider field margins, awkward field corners and non-invasive hedgerow management.
- A All hedgerows are maintained to encourage natural biodiversity while at the same time acting as a shelter for organic pest control. We also use Riparian Zoning along all watercourses. This is a 3m uncultivated strip will acts as a nature corridor



- along field boundaries. This area will not only benefit from improved water quality but will also assist in improving biodiversity & carbon sequestration.
- B Old hay meadows are some of the most species rich habitats in Ireland but are a
  very rare habitat these days. We dedicate 4 acres of land to hay on the farm at our
  environmentally sensitive area. This has a wide variety of species and is an excellent
  habitat for invertebrates, farmyard specialist birds and small mammals. As hay has a
  later cutting date than silage, we are able to keep tis biodiversity habitat in place
  until June/ July which allows for increased biodiversity.
- Effective Nutrient Management Planning, which involves using crop nutrients as
  efficiently as possible to improve productivity while protecting the environment.
   NMP helps to reduce excessive nutrient build up and lessen environmental risks.

**YES**. We still plant a mix of wildflowers in the headlines and tramlines of our Brussels Sprout crop.

- We do this because aphids and pests don't like some of these varieties so this acts as a natural deterrent to avoid having to spray the crop for these unwanted pests.
- The wildflower mix also acts as a shelter for natural pest eliminators which feed on pests and aphids acting as organic pest control.
- Our alternative action is all of our idle/ stubble ground is planted with Winter Oats.
   This year we planted 308 acres on this idle ground to act as a Cover crop during the Winter. Winter Oats are a quick growing cover crop that creates a mat of organic matter which helps prevent soil erosion, smother weeds and helps provide a habitat for many different species above the ground. Cover crops also help improve the activity of microbes in the soil and produce food for earthworms and other life in the soil.

Our environmentally sensitive area includes a Wild bee hotel, bird boxes and we have also introduced bat boxes into this area too. These are all made from recycling old pallets and wood on the farm and they have been erected on the perimeter of the farm adjoining Balrath Woods.

We have completed biodiversity mapping at 3 of our sites. All sites have been given recommended actions that can be used in conjunction with the specific habitat maps produced on their site. Actions completed included:

In addition to biodiversity actions completed in 2022, site champions are conserving natural spaces using the maps and zone information produced. They will be implementing site specific action plans with targets in response to this out to 2025.

In 2022 we completed biodiversity mapping on 8 farms in Co. Meath - a mixture of pasture and arable fields.

- Farmland reports were developed with the aim to address the pollinator use of linear habitat features (hedgerows) on farms in Co. Meath, and the implications for conservation.
- Farms were surveyed to create a detailed plant and pollinator dataset. This dataset will be used to inform future linear field boundary management recommendations.
- A total of 1,384 pollinators were surveyed in 2022.
- The farms were ranked by highest abundance of pollinators.
- A total of 19 different bee and butterfly species were observed.
- Ireland has 21 native bumblebees, 5 were found on the farms.
- Ireland has 35 butterfly species, 12 were found on farms.
- Pollinator food (Flowers) had been identified in each are of the farms.
- Recommendations were given on how to protect and enhance these areas.

#### In 2022 we also engaged with:

- BRIDE valley biodiversity project: Kepak farm was scored for biodiversity and
  presented with a feedback report containing current good biodiversity measures and
  actions and where we can improve.
- SAI Regenerative Agriculture Programme: Kepak remains on the steering committee in 2022 and 2023, and as the only Beef industry member we are excited to play this pivotal role.
- This program has further developed into a framework of monitoring on farm
  practices that affect regenerative agriculture. In 2022 the programme designed a
  monitoring tool for on farm measurement, in 2023 this tool will be piloted by SAI
  platform founding members and will measure indicators in line with impact areas
  such as: \*Soil \* Climate \*Biodiversity \* Water Quality \*Farmer Livelihoods.
- With biodiversity as one of the main pillars within regenerative farming, we are expecting this to provide significant support to our biodiversity strategy.

We are Ireland's first meadery in 200 years, a small family business located in Kinsale, Co. Cork making award winning meads fermented from honey and fruit. We do tours and tastings at the meadery covering the history of mead and bees in Ireland, bee and real honey education, raw honey tasting and making and tasting mead. We are passionate about all things bees & honey.

A - Our wild area at the side of the site is self-seeding and we have not engaged in any planting this past year apart for removing plastic rubbish. It's a small area but has guite a few plant types as listed on the database. We did not see a lot of bees or bumble bees through May, possibly foraging off the huge hawthorn blossom this

- A The tall fennel plants, up to 8ft high continue to be a huge magnet for many bees and wasps in August which seems to attract many types to the very small surface blossoms.
- We did see large numbers of bumblebees on the herbs in August as well as several sightings of hummingbird hawk-moths. We did not see any miner bees again this year on the steep stony section on the area where we have drilled some small holes.
- **D** We added water to our two mini bee hotels on quite a few occasions during May and June but the bees and bumble bees did not visit and at this point, we don't think the design works as a mini bee hotel.
- Denis completed a UCC permaculture course this year with Kinsale college permaculture expert and has used the knowledge to create a much more balanced pollinator friendly vegetable garden.
- We had several sessions with Paul Kelly of Chanting Bee Apiary to educate us further on Honey Bees and the continued challenges they are facing from pesticides, disease and invasive predators.

**1b.** Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in **2023? YES.** We left our wild area self seed this year and did not do any new planting and also we discontinued any further wildflower seed gifting.

1c. Did you choose an alternative action to managing honeybee hives/an apiary in 2023? While we agree honey bees are not threatened with extinction like many other bees, we don't agree that they are not in a healthy place. We hear many stories from beekeepers about impact of pesticide spraying impacting their bees, cutting of pollinator friendly hedgerows, impact of disease and volatile weather patterns. Also, the continued sale of so much cheap adulterated honey in our main supermarkets is making it very difficult for beekeepers to sustain themselves. Ireland is still a really low producer of honey and there's no sign this is changing and this is a reflective of the wider situation with biodiversity loss in Ireland as reflected in the Citizen's Assembly Forum report on Biodiversity loss.

- Our main effort is through our meadery tours where we host thousands of visitors each year.
- A big part of our tour is tasting different types of raw unfiltered honey from spring, summer and autumn and talking through the challenges facing our bees, both wild and honeybees. We continue to find a majority of people are not aware that only a small percentage of honey consumed in Ireland is from Irish honeybees or even honey.
- We continue to educate people on the massive biodiversity loss that has taken place
  in our countryside over the last two generations and what steps people can take at
  home and in their community to engage in pollinator and biodiversity friendly
  practices.
- We continue to use the All Ireland Pollinator plan posters to educate people on the plants they can use or pollinator planting in their homes and communities.



We will continue to convert grass lawn to areas with pollinator friendly plants in the spring 2024.

- A & C Maintaining our Woodland Environmental Fund Partnership In 2020 / 2021, we partnered with the Woodland Environmental Fund and Sustineo to plant over 75K native Irish trees to restore native woodland and improve biodiversity across three sites in Ireland - Wicklow, Westmeath and Galway. In 2021/2022, we planted a further 35K trees across two sites in Kerry and Cork totaling 110K trees planted. Our latest ecosystem report stated that this planting has yielded 94,008 trees, of 10 different native species across the 5 sites.
- As part of a separate global Accenture initiative with OneTreePlanted.org, over 6,000 further trees have been planted across Ireland in 2022. These have been geo-tagged and can be referenced here.
- In 2023 we continued to sponsor and maintain these sites as necessary to ensure their benefits continue to be realised and our support continues to drive progress on Ireland's native tree cover.
- We continue to care for our wildflowers and other vegetation that we planted in an effort to 'Greenify the Dock' allowing us to create space for our pollinators to

thrive. Additionally, we have done extensive pollinator friendly, native wildflower planting in a selection of our Dublin offices where space in available (The Dock and Grand Canal Plaza). We have looked into bug hotels and other supports for non-honey bee pollinators but none were practical given the design and locations of our offices.

**1b.** Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in **2023? NO**. We did not supply wildflower mixes but we will consider alternative actions such as reduced mowing and increasing planting of native hedgerows where possible.

1c. Did you choose an alternative action to managing honeybee hives/an apiary in 2023? NO, but we will assess how we can facilitate and monitor other pollinators on our sites or in our communities.

On-site Bees - Following the success of our partnership with Hive Mind to provide beehives in community locations, Accenture partnered with them to install two hives at The Dock in Dublin. These hives serve as a symbol of our commitment to improving the state of nature in our operations, while providing engagement and upskilling opportunities to employees through workshops and hive visits. The bees are young colonies of Northern European Dark Honeybees, Apis Mellifera. Their first year here should see them get stronger as they get accustomed to their new location with the main goal this year to help them to progress and strengthen. The bees second year should be more fruitful as they thrive in their environment and there is then an expectation that there will be a surplus of honey which may be utilised by employees. We, with our partner Hivemind, continue to sponsor 8 thriving hives around community locations in Ireland, with up to 800k native bees in total, in the following locations: Coolmine Rehab locations in Dublin and Cork, Peter McVerry centre at Kerdiffstown House in County Kildare and Tabor Lodge rehab centre in Cork.

# 2. Which evidence-based <u>COMMUNICATION (F)</u> pollinator-biodiversity action(s) has your business/ organisation taken in 2023?

- F: Action 18 2023 saw Accenture launch our Nature and Biodiversity module in our Sustainability Quotient, with over 22,000 global employees having completed it so far. Our 'Sustainability Quotient' is a company-wide learning program that enables all our people to understand and consider how our work can have a more sustainable outcome and drive change in line with the SDGs.
- Commencing on Earth Day, April 2023, we ran a 5 week-long 'Eco Action' campaign. During this period, we encouraged employees to volunteer, learn and make a change. We hosted biodiversity related information sessions with organisations such as 'Nature Therapy Ireland'. During this time we also amplified the awareness of ongoing virtual volunteering opportunities we offer, with organisations such as Zooniverse and GLOBE Observer, and sustainable employee benefits such as discounts with local organic food providers.
- We continue to have a dedicated, employee-led group within Accenture which promotes the All-Ireland Pollinator ethos. The Bee Team is an active group who are doing incredible work to kick-start initiatives, while also providing education to our employees through events, competitions and fundraising. Recently, they ran an event at one of our community hives in Coolmine Rehabilitation Centre where employees had the opportunity to visit the site, learn about beekeeping and the importance of pollinators of all kinds, and taste some incredible honey.
- Accenture were proud to launch the Accenture Sustainability Challenge with Change X in 2021, the aim of which is to provide funding for local community environmental projects. In 2023, Accenture's funding is estimated to catalyse 50 community-led projects across Ireland. A range of biodiversity friendly projects were launched and delivered as part of this challenge already such as the FreshWater watch, Open Orchard, The Green Plan and Community Fridge.

 In 2023, Accenture's team in UK and Ireland has supported Business for Nature, the World Business Council for Sustainable Development and the World Economic Forum in creating and launching global <u>Sector Actions for Nature</u>, guidance for businesses who are looking to halt and reverse nature loss. This involved globalising some of the guidance which Accenture had released in the UK as <u>Get Nature Positive</u>.

- We hope to continue partnering with Change X with a particular focus on nature and biodiversity protection and restoration within communities across Ireland.
- We will continue to drive biodiversity and nature related employee engagement opportunities across education and awareness and volunteering through promotion of existing and creation of new partnerships.
- We will continue to collaborate with our workplace operations team to explore ways to use our spaces to promote pollinators, through the use of actions 1-15, and to reduce nature impacts across other areas of our office operations.







- A We have recorded and mapped the native tree species present on the New Field Site.
- B Wildflower meadows have been introduced in several different areas around the site, the areas around the two trees in our car park and a large area next to our contractor's compound.

- B We have designated the large field adjacent to the main site as a wildflower meadow. Surveys of the current species present have been conducted and will be repeated yearly to monitor the number of pollinator friendly species present. A yearly cut and lift mowing regime has been put in place for this field to reduce the nutrient levels in the soil and encourage growth of pollinator friendly wildflowers. These pollinator friendly plants will make for a nice addition to the scenery of Astellas as well as promoting biodiversity.
- D The sandbank for solitary bees has been maintained and monitored for activity, with evidence of use by solitary bees being recorded. New potential areas for earth banks and stone walls have been marked for clearing in October to be used as nesting areas for more solitary bees. Ivy and Brambles adjacent to these areas will be maintained as a food source.
- **F** A biodiversity tour has been set up on the Astellas site which has been presented to various visitors and employees onsite. Signage has been erected throughout this biodiversity tour to further educate anyone partaking in this tour. Areas such as the sand bank for mining bees, the bee hotels for solitary bees, the apiary, bat boxes, log piles, pollinator friendly planting and the onsite food digester have been included in this tour. We have set up a wildlife camera in different locations around the site to capture videos of different species that we have on the site.

### **Invasive species**

- We mapped the invasive species Japanese Knotweed and American Skunk Cabbage in the SAC.
- We completed a large-scale management plan for the removal of Japanese Knotweed located on the New Field Site and have implemented a post removal management plan for the area.
- We designed a Rapid Assessment tool for the wildflower meadow in the New Field. This will allow us to monitor any changes in species diversity going forward, giving us a means to measure the response to our management efforts and monitor any ecological succession in newly restored areas such as the knotweed removal site.

- A private project in the Sandymount area this year saw a close partnership with the clients to create and provide an environment that not only met their needs as a family but enhanced and promoted biodiversity within a shared space. Areas of grass were agreed to be removed and large pockets of planting inserted to be a mix of ground level planting, climbers, specimen trees and a large vertically planted wall. The range of plants attended to all manner of day and night time pollinators and would continue to provide interest and shelter throughout the seasonal changes. Specimen trees were predominantly native and not only provide privacy for the clients but shelter and food for a variety of nesting habits. The total quantity of designated planting amounted to 60m2, nearly half of the allocated space.
- A community incorporated planting project in the Goats Town area enhanced a central green space within a shared residential area. Areas of lawn were reduced to incorporate more pollinator friendly plants that not only provided seasonal interest but structure and shelter for pollinators moving into the autumnal and winter months. At least 2/3rds of the allocated zones were designated for pollinator enriching planting whilst also including the desire for seated areas, meandering paths and space for young children to enjoy.
- With each project there has been a continued and direct interaction and inclusion of the clients and residents to ensure a further sense of ownership and duty of care with each implementation of pollinator and bio diverse encouraging space. Easy maintenance and management packs support these discussions creating further awareness and a sense of pride of these invaluable additions to

the shared spaces. All information to which is referred back to the pollinator plan and the bigger picture be achieved. Heavy emphasis on all projects during maintenance is the conscious moving away from the use of pesticides and using natural alternatives that are tried, tested and have been proven successful due to collective experiences and knowledge from within the Austen Associates team.





- As the business supporter of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan (AIPP), COLAS Joint Venture (CJV) has embarked on a journey to promote pollinator-friendly biodiversity actions.
- CJV became the AIPP's business supporter on July 13, 2023, and is working assiduously to enhance its biodiversity initiatives.
- **B** As a motorway maintenance company working for Transport Infrastructure Ireland, our primary objective was to reduce grass mowing. To achieve this goal, we selected two specific motorway routes namely, the central median of the M/N6 motorway based on traffic frequency and tourist attraction. The conscious effort to lessen habitat disturbance for pollinators resulted in decreased mowing frequency, allowing a diverse group of plants in the central median strip to serve as an ideal habitat for pollinators during the summer months.
- **D** This approach not only supported plant growth but also provided a safe breeding ground for pollinators while saving unnecessary fuel usage, reducing carbon emissions, and mitigating noise pollution from traffic rush.
- As part of our maintenance routine, we ensured that only a small roadside strip
  was mowed for visibility purposes while ensuring no pesticides were used on

plants creating an environment conducive to the natural development of pollinators' health.

• In 2022 we had Scott Cawley Ltd. ecological consultants on site to conduct a site multidisciplinary study, bat survey and breeding bird surveys. From this we received a detailed map in January 2023 outlining the different habitats we had on site to try and improve upon for the year. Since then, we have allowed ~6,500m2 of land along a pedestrian access road through the site (East Road) rewild naturally with reduced grass cuttings, signage indicating it's a pollinator friendly zone. These signs have also been introduced into areas where improved pollinator friendly planting has taken place.

Species found in areas which are now being conserved and signage put up include;

B - As part of our 2023 biodiversity plan, we reduced mowing across all of our sites in Dublin. We participated in No-Mow May and carried it through until August with no mowing across Equinix's IBX facilities in Dublin until August to let the grass grow wild. This has been a great success for the pollinators it was observed that there was an increase in wildlife around the site particularly birds like Bullfinches, Chaffinch and Goldfinch along with Yellowhammers. The local Hare population have also used the enchained vegetation to give birth to their young leverets.

- B With the enhancements the grass meadows we decided to leave the grass areas in the back section of our site to grow until the end of September as a diverse number of flowers are growing in the area. We were thrilled to find that the Bee Orchid has been observed in numerous locations around the site. This species of orchid although found throughout the country is a rare species of flower and the growth of this flower in the grass areas is contributed to letting the areas go wild and not using any fungicides on site.
- **C** We have increased our pollinator-friendly planting on the grounds. In late autumn early winter there will be bulbs and shrubs sown into the grass areas to create long flowering grass meadows that will provide food early in the season through until late in the year for the pollinators.
- **C** We removed non-native hedge rows and replaced them with native shrubs along with planting native elder and rowan trees at locations around the site
- **C** In November / December 2023 1000 native Irish flowers will planted to support pollinators in Spring 2024.
- **D** We have created areas specifically for solitary bees. In selected areas around the site, close to food sources, the grass has been scraped back to bare soil to provide 5 earth banks / habitats for solitary mining bees.
- **D** We moved the bee hotels to a new location at the back of the building following advice from a biodiversity expert. The bee hotels are now situated near the orchards.
- **E** We have eliminated pesticides on all sites.

**1b.** Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in **2023? NO.** We understand the issues associated with wildflower seeds and for that reason we do not do gift/sow or in any way support or fund wildflower seeds. Our actions are listed above.

Our biodiversity initiative this year was around developing areas specifically for solitary bees. We invited in a biodiversity specialist via SAP landscapers to give advice around what we could do on site to help with solitary bees.

- We have not engaged our suppliers apart from SAP landscapes who are helping us with this initiative.
- We have engaged our community by promoting our participation in the DCs for Bees Orchards in the Community Project which as been promoted online and in some local community press and this communication includes messaging about the importance of supporting biodiversity and halting the decline of our bee population. We engaged directly via our staff with local schools, Tidy Towns and other community organisations right across Ireland as we donate orchards out to these organisations to help them to get involved in this biodiversity project and the response has been very positive.
- We have engaged our employees in several ways through our All Hands meetings where we provide updates on what we are doing across our sites and WHY we are doing it. Sharing out the AIPP with them to read and educate themselves around what they can do at home. We invited our staff to attend a bee sanctuary Beewise in Co. Meath which was well attended. This provided employees with an opportunity to spend a day learning about biodiversity and the different types of bees, plants and other species that are important for the ecosystem. Also, as above, our employees get directly involved in the Orchards in the Community

project by reaching out to their local communities and also helping to plant the orchards. For No Mow May, we have signage on the grounds of our sites promoting the initiative.

Fingleton White volunteers planted 1012 native trees in Rockview Walkways, an ongoing project of Laois Friends (Laois Friends, Special Needs, Social and Recreational Committee). Rockview Walkways is a 20-acre high nature-value woodland that contains native trees and hedgerows, an orchard, eight bird nesting boxes and deadwood in two locations in the wood to encourage invertebrate species.

Planted trees will support biodiversity, especially bees in the orchard. Tree species are listed below:

Moreover, we are in the process of researching and sourcing pollinator-friendly seeds and plants that are native to our region. Our intention is to implement these in the coming seasons to further enhance our site's contribution to local biodiversity. We believe these steps will not only support our local pollinator populations but will also contribute to the larger ecological balance of our area.

Recognizing the potential competitive pressures that increased honeybee populations might put on wild species, we focused on enhancing habitats

Our efforts in reducing the use of chemicals and providing natural habitats, like undisturbed patches of land and water sources, are our contribution to ensuring a thriving pollinator community.

- Due to poor weather in July and August some of the replacement cultivated forage plants failed to flower.
- Knapweed weed and Devil's bit scabious in one of two damp wildflower areas
  were trashed by an unannounced flailing visit from ESB in 2022 which caused
  serious compaction. Hopefully an alternative forage area can be developed next
  season.

   Two new hoverfly species were recorded (Sericomyia silentis and Eristalis intricaria), three new solitary wasp species, Agrgogytes mystaceus, Ectemnius sp, Netellia sp. - thanks to Ryan Mitchell & Owen Beckett for ID - and an additional solitary bee species, Megachile willughbiella.
- Gross management has resulted in promising increases in knapweed and bush vetch, both of which are key forage for the Large Carder. The Large Carder colony here remained active into September.
- However, the most significant pollinator protection advances this season have been off-site.
- NPWS funded a Small Recorder project, RU-86, on surviving populations of grassland Large Carders in South Mayo and Galway, combining fieldwork on

- forage plant communities and dissemination workshops in Mayo and on the Galway border.
- The main aim of the fieldwork phase been identifying areas with strong forage plant communities; but a most encouraging aspect is that five new high-quality sites have actually yielded Bombus muscorum sightings from a first speculative visit, which a second visit confirmed in three of them.

- ACTION 3 Created a naturally regenerated long-flowering meadow through reduced mowing – we did this in a one acre field - we did not mow this meadow all summer and it became a long flowering meadow and it was not grazed until October after seed had fallen.

- A –There is an area of approximately 5000 m<sup>2</sup> on the Meath site that is planted with trees. Indaver make sure to maintain this area as well as the hedgerows that surround the Meath and Dublin sites in order to protect the existing areas for pollinators.
- B Certain areas of the Meath site, such as verges beside the building and designated patches of grass with an area of approx. 3000m<sup>2</sup>, are only mown three times per year. There are a number of berms on site, making up approximately 10,000 m<sup>2</sup>, that are only mowed once per year.
- **C** At the Meath facility we planted a native wildflower meadow in the fields adjacent to the site. These fields are owned by Indaver but were previously leased for farming purposes. This year it was decided to restore the fields and they were reseeded with grass and native wildflowers and left unmown to create a meadow covering an area of 30 acres, or 121,000 m<sup>2</sup>.
- **D** Two insect hotels were installed in the Transfer Station site in Dublin. This is in addition to the insect hotels and two bee hives that are already maintained at the Meath site.

- E We have virtually eliminated pesticide use. The Meath site replaced pesticide use with a foam system called Foamstream by Weedingtech. Pesticides are only used in rare cases where the new weed control system can't reach.
- 1b. Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in 2023? To encourage wild pollinators we participated in the No Mow May campaign, allowing all grassy areas of the site to grow for the month. It was considered a success as some species were spotted that had not been observed on site before, such as the Red-tailed bumble bee and a 5 spot burnet moth.
- 1c. Did you choose an alternative action to managing honeybee hives/an apiary in **2023? YES.** While Indaver maintain two honeybee hives on site, we are aware that this is not considered a biodiversity action itself, as the bees may compete for food with wild pollinators. As noted above in 1b. we took part in the 'No Mow May' campaign this year, while also encouraging staff to do the same at home.

- Business in the Community Ireland completed an Ecologist & Biodiversity





We also spread some native Irish wildflowers along the earth banks and near the forestry areas. - NTR supplied all the materials for a class of TY students to make solitary bee hotels and then place them in Bunnyconnelan windfarm.

- A We have continued to nurture a hedgerow tunnel which connects one of our yurts to the main drive. It is a nice feature but also a very thriving double hedge

- which this year has had lots of fungi develop at ground level as we leave a bed of leaves on the edges.
- A & C We continue to nurture all trees planted to date and have planted ten new natives during the 2022-3 bareroot season. Recently we have found that the bark of some of our trees is being damaged probably by deer we are trying the use of soap bags around the trunks to deter them with some success.
- **C** We have mown paths to each of our yurts and have sown local wildflower seed into the edges of these during 2023 we saw an increase in wildflowers along the edges of these paths.
- **D** We have established a number of woodpiles around our communal buildings.
- **D** We have created some dry hedges.
- E We do not use chemicals or pesticides at all. We use a burner to burn
  persistent weeds along paths when necessary. We have a large site and are
  adopting an approach of minimal disturbance of all of the land we maintain the

- **E** Herbicide usage on site was reduced further in 2023, with manual weeding in place for all shrub beds. Minimal usage remains on the lawn areas only and we're working closely with our landscaping vendor who is currently scoping potential alternative technologies.
- In the Woodland Area, as part of the continuous work on Ash Dieback, a small number of Ash trees was identified for removal. In addition, preventative measures to reduce the further spread were completed by collecting the fallen leaves from the base of the tress and woodland floor.

Conscious of ensuring there is adequate forage for the wild pollinator species also, no additional honeybees are being introduced to site. In addition to this population, a wild native Irish honeybee colony has been located on

site in the woodland area. The qualified beekeeper monitors this hive also when on site. Due to this colony being recorded by Regeneron on the NBDC recording portal, researchers in NUIG contacted the company to be part of a research project called 'Outside the Box'. This colony is one of over 200 free-living colonies surveyed across Ireland as part of the 'Outside the Box' project which aims to delve deeper into the question of how Irish free-living colonies are able to survive, unaided, outside of conventional beekeeping settings. This project is the first scientific program surveying and studying wild honeybee colonies on a national scale. Its completion will shed light onto the possible traits that are enabling long-term survival in free-living honeybee colonies and will provide invaluable results from which wild honeybee research and conservation will move forward.

- As part of an Earth Day event on site in Apr 2023, a qualified ecologist provided a presentation to employees on biodiversity asking what exactly it is and why does it matter.

- **C** Since the last report, like last year, we renovated another large bed that contained some poor growing buxus hedging that were surrounded by pebble. It was an area that would not have been of much benefit to pollinators. We filled this bed with non scripta bluebell bulbs, Galanthus Nivalis bulbs, alliums, muscari armeniacum (these being the most beneficial to pollinators) and also lots of other flower bulbs. As the bulb plants were dying off, we over-sowed Crimson clover and Phacelia into the bed.
- **E** Any weed removal done throughout the year was done by hand without the use of chemicals. We removed a large amount of bindweed by hand that was growing through hedging that borders the property. As of now, the hedge is completely bindweed free.

Servier also participated in the 100 Million Trees Project planting 1515 native Irish trees on site in March of this year. Servier are partnered with Gorey and Arklow Tidy Town committees.



- C We planted native flowering trees and extended our native hedge of hawthorn. The flowering trees planted were Spindle, Hawthorn, Rowen, Willow, Cherry and Elder. The hedge planted contains mostly Hawthorn with Spindle, Cherry and Hazel sporadically planted throughout. In all we have about 2000 trees planted on the property which is a mixture of flowering and non-flowering species.
- **C** We have planted a few hundred crocus, snowdrop and blue bell *non scripta* around the park.
- **E** We do not spray any pesticides around the park.
- A & C We have 6 flower beds that we maintain: 2 with wildflowers, 2 with herbs, 2 with pollinator friendly plants.
- C We have planted over 650m of willow fence and created a willow dome.
- **D** We have a few piles of sand that we scrape the plants off so as to expose them. All trees and bushes are still small yet so provide little overground nesting habitat as of yet.
- **E** We do not use pesticides on site. Instead, we are using shovels to scrape the worst and then flame them after with a small flame thrower.

**1b.** Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in **2023? YES.** In half of one bed that we usually sow wildflowers seeds in we let part of it alone. It has produced Woundwort and some species of wild mustard. These have been very popular with bees and especially the mustard with hoverflies. Next year we will not plant wildflowers in this bed and allow the native woundwort and mustards to spread. We will selectively weed out grasses, bindweed and creeping buttercup which are plants we feel that can overtake the other species.

We may change our structure of mowing as we have a lot of grass that is only cut once a year and instead increase the amount of area given to mowing 5-6 times a year.

The soil berms on 3 of our working sites that have grown natural vegetation have been left untouched for the duration of the works. A number of existing protected areas on sites have been fenced off to avoid disturbance during construction works. We protected a Fisheries listed stream that attracted a lot of natural vegetation and fauna during the summer of 2023.
- B Working with the landscapers we have reduced mowing throughout the Head
  Office site and with only edge mowing along our wildflower areas. There is no
  grass mowing on any of our construction sites. All designated areas are protected
  as part of Part A of Pollinator Biodiversity Actions.
- C All of our pollinator friendly planting takes place within our working construction sites. As part of our company ESG goals we reuse materials to make planter boxes in areas that we cannot create planter beds and to reuse the old Walls Construction safety helmets as hanging baskets. We are in the process of working with the Landscape Architect of sites to include more pollinator friendly trees and shrubs into the final landscape structure of the build. We also create Tree Protection areas with boundary fencing to prevent site activities encroaching on these areas, allowing them to flourish all year round. We also have sown wildflowers on existing soil berms in order to enhance biodiversity.
- D From a survey carried out on our Head Office grounds we have a south facing
  earth bank that have evidence of nests belonging to solidary mining bees, this
  has been retained. We have protected designated areas on a number of sites to
  facilitate and maintain existing nesting habitats. Soil berms have grown wild grass
  that has attracted Bees and other insects to the area. Our planter boxes and
  hanging helmets have attracted Bees, Butterflies and a number of other insects.
- **E** Eliminated the use of pesticides and herbicides on grounds within Head Office and within our working sites. Within our working sites grassed areas, berms and embankments are allowed to grow naturally and are not treated with herbicides/pesticides.
- **F** A number of our working sites have worked with surrounding schools and communities in promoting pollinator friendly actions by;
  - Introducing polytunnels to grow plants and vegetables
  - Landscaping at local school to allow them to incite AIPP friendly actions
  - Communication and consultation with local community groups/schools in relation to pollinator friendly actions.
  - Pollinator friendly artwork displayed on our hoarding
  - Designated planter boxes supplied by a local community group

1b. Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in 2023?

YES. Walls Construction have allowed all site berms, embankments and soiled areas to grow natural vegetation and grass. We have enabled natural vegetation to grow in the Tree Protection areas. In addition to this we have sown some wildflowers in sustainable planter boxes, helmets and other constructed containers, as some of our city centre sites are not in a position to implement pollinator friendly actions. These wildflowers have been sourced responsibly from a reputable company.

1c. Did you choose an alternative action to managing honeybee hives/an apiary in 2023? NO. We continue to maintain our Hives in our Cork Office. Our hives are managed by our Contracts Manager with regular updates provided quarterly.

- Sent out company notices/emails with information (AIPP resource and in house guidance) on carrying out pollinator friendly actions on site and at home.
- Engagement with local schools was carried out on some of our working sites- this included creating a garden area for students and building of a greenhouse.
- Biodiversity and Pollinator Friendly Actions are communicated and discussed at monthly HSELT meetings with some sites having clear objectives in relation to pollinator friendly actions. Walls Construction have an overall objective to communicate and carry out at least 10 Pollinator Friendly Actions per annum which we tend to exceed.





#### A - Protect What You Have:

- Wildacres is a 17.5 acre nature reserve and biodiversity education centre between Brittas Bay and Redcross in Co Wicklow. When we bought the land in 2017 it was 4 fields of heavily sheep grazed pasture.
- The field perimeters have mature trees forming hedgerow/linear woodland boundaries but other than these there was little in the way of wild habitat. The mature hedgerow is flourishing, and we have planted more trees to fill in gaps along with many other biodiversity initiatives detailed below.

#### **B** - Reduce Mowing:

- The only mowing we do at Wildacres is to cut the 5ft wide grass pathway to be able to bring visitors on guided tours of the nature reserve.
- We cut the pathway with a 100% electric mower and keep the blades high enough to allow red/white clovers to thrive.
- We cut the long flowering wildflower meadow once a year mid-September but are hoping to move towards conservation grazing for these 4 acres.

#### C - Pollinator friendly planting:

- We have planted 12,000 native trees and shrubs at Wildacres over the past 5 years which are flowering and fruiting.
- These are set across 2 plots of native woodland (6 acre and 1 acre), several copses, over 2km of double hedgerow, a 1-acre traditional orchard, a small apiary, almost 1km of riparian (riverbank) zone and some container planting focused on pollinators.
- We have a 4 acre naturally regenerating wildflower meadow which we help along with plug planting of native wildflowers grown in our Tree and Wildflower nursery, from locally collected seed.
- We now have 25 wildlife ponds which are naturally regenerating with native pond plants. Our demonstration pollinator flower bed is alive with bees,

butterflies, hoverflies on the many pollinator-friendly plants such as Verbena, Geranium Rosanne, Erysimum Bowles mauve, Foxgloves and more.

#### **D - Provide Nesting Habitats:**

- Aside from the 2km of native hedgerow we have planted, we are managing the mature perimeter hedgerow for wildlife too.
- We have created earth banks, bee hotels and a stone wall which are being used by solitary bees.

#### **E - Reduce Use of Pesticides:**

We do not use pesticides (insecticides, rodenticides, herbicides, or fungicides) of any sort at Wildacres.

### 1b. Did you choose an alternative action to sowing/gifting wildflower seed mixes in 2023?

We never purchase or sell non-native wildflower seeds. Our wildflower meadow
is a naturally regenerating one. We have purchased some specific native
wildflower seed such as Yellow Rattle and Devil's bit scabious and have collected
local native wildflower seed.

### 1c. Did you choose an alternative action to managing honeybee hives/an apiary in 2023?

- YES. We manage a small apiary in a countryside setting on the nature reserve and produce raw honey sustainably which we sell locally.
- We have kept hive numbers low to have enough forage for wild pollinators.
- We have optimised the land for all pollinators through all the rewilding and pollinator friendly planting and management.
- We are experienced beekeepers demonstrating that local food produced responsibly and sustainably, in tune with nature, is a climate and biodiversity action. It is better to buy local sustainably produced honey than cheap imported supermarket honey that is decimating wild pollinators in other countries.



#### WHY Pollinators? www.pollinators.ie

Without pollinators, many plants would not exist. Globally, 100 crops provide 90% of the world's food. Of these, 71 are pollinated by bees. On the island of Ireland, insects pollinate more than three quarters of our wild plants, providing food and shelter for birds and mammals and contributing to healthy ecosystems. They are also responsible for the healthy yields of many crops, fruits, and vegetables such as apples, berries, tomatoes, and pumpkins. We need pollinators to maintain a nutritious food supply; to nourish our health and wellbeing; to support the livelihoods of our farmers; to continue growing our own food; and to protect biodiversity. And of course, pollinators deserve a landscape that supports them for their own sake.

#### WHO are our pollinators in Ireland?

On the island of Ireland, we have one 'managed' pollinator, the honey bee, and over 100 different types of wild bee. 20% of wild bees are bumblebees and 80% are solitary bees. Research tells us that we need an abundance and diversity of wild bees as well as healthy managed honey bees to pollinate crops and wild plants.

#### WHY are pollinators in trouble?

Research shows that wild pollinators are in decline. This is mainly because we've drastically reduced the habitats that provide them with food and shelter. Other factors include pesticides, pests and diseases, and climate change. To help them, we need to ensure pollinators have food, shelter, and safety from chemicals. On the island of Ireland, one third of wild bee species is threatened with extinction.

The All-Ireland Pollinator Plan is a shared plan of action: together, we can take steps to restore pollinator populations to healthy levels.

#### Why engage with the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan?

Support of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2021-2025 allows businesses to:

- **Customers/Consumers** Demonstrate pollinator-biodiversity credentials to customers and consumers who seek to support nature-positive brands.

#### On-site actions to help pollinators

- **B. Mow less in grassy areas** (and remember to lift the cuttings). And cut less of your native hedgerow to allow the flowers to grow on the older wood.

  - N.B. Gifting/sponsoring wildflower seed mixes is NOT a biodiversity action.
- **D. Provide wild pollinator nesting habitat** tussocky grass beneath hedgerows, old stone walls/south facing earth banks/bee hotels.
- E. Eliminate or reduce the use of pesticides (herbicides/insecticides)

• Reminder: Honey bee hives are NOT a biodiversity action. Honey bees are a managed pollinator and not under threat. Increased honeybee numbers may create competition for food for our wild bees. Wonderful as a hobby – always check with an expert from a local beekeeping association.

No land? No problem. We have a range of communication actions to support the move towards nature-positive.
