'We are focused on evaluating, protecting, and enhancing biodiversity on our site and are not engaged in the sowing or gifting of wildflower seed mixes. Instead, we are working on nurturing our wildflower meadows and verges, through reduced mowing, to encourage great pollinator food sources such as Dandelions and Clover.'

Ballygowan will expand in the coming year upon on-site mapping (Action 1: Page 7) as part of their plan to identify species across the site.









In line with the AIPP evidence-based 'Businesses: actions to help pollinators' guidelines, Ballygowan (Britvic) has delivered the following actions:	Evidence-based Action delivered:
We put into action our plan for managing long flowering meadows. We also took the step of expanding on the area growing it from approx. 2723m2 to 22,941m2. The meadows were allowed to grow all year with cutting and removal of cuttings taking place in September. We let Dandelions (and Ivy) bloom across the site as great pollinator-food sources. Our wild scrub area was becoming overgrown. We cut the canopy back to allow more light into the area which resulted in fresh growth and a visible increase in naturally generating wildflowers.	Action I Develop a plan to protect existing sources of food and shelter
